Strengthening Community Health in Romania The contribution of WHO

What have we developed?

1. Learning from other community health experiences:

Development of four country case studies including Netherlands, Norway, Hungary and Slovenia and comparing with the case in Romania.

Country case studies explain how community health services are organized, governed, financed and staffed. They describe the components of community health services delivery including the scope of services, type of providers and centres, collaboration and management.

2. Deep dive into monitoring and evaluation tools:

Development of a specific case study on monitoring and evaluation tools for community health in Catalonia, Spain. It included population health, health and care activity, quality of care, health workforce planning, incentives and satisfaction, and patient satisfaction.



What have we developed?

3. Support and guidance in the development of the Handbook of Community Health

Provide examples from other countries on guidelines for community health development, specially addressed to community nurses.

Development of guidelines fiches for monitoring **priority chronic diseases** for:

- Vulnerable adults: hypertension, diabetes mellitus
- Vulnerable elderly: chronic heart failure, stroke, chronic obstructive pulmonary disease and dementia

4. Design and development of materials for the training of district public health directorates professionals and public authorities

Training to be held in Bucharest on 20-21 June 2022 in a train-of-trainers modality.



Work ahead in 2022

1. Identification and transfer of good practice examples for health promotion interventions
2. Comparative analysis of payment models for preventive services in Europe: policy brief and international workshop
